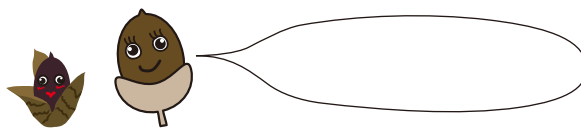




Acorns in Ikutaryokuchi Park

The acorn is called "Donguri" in Japan. It is the nut of the oaks and classified in Fagaceae. 22 kinds of Donguris are distributed all over Japan, and you can easily find several types in Ikutaryokuchi park.

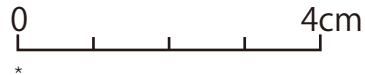

The nut of Japanese horse-chestnut is called "Tochinomi" in Japan. Though it looks like "Donguri", it is separate family of the Fagaceae. The "Tochinomi" used to be processed as the emergency rations during the famine, especially in the "Tohoku" region (the northeastern area) of Japan.
